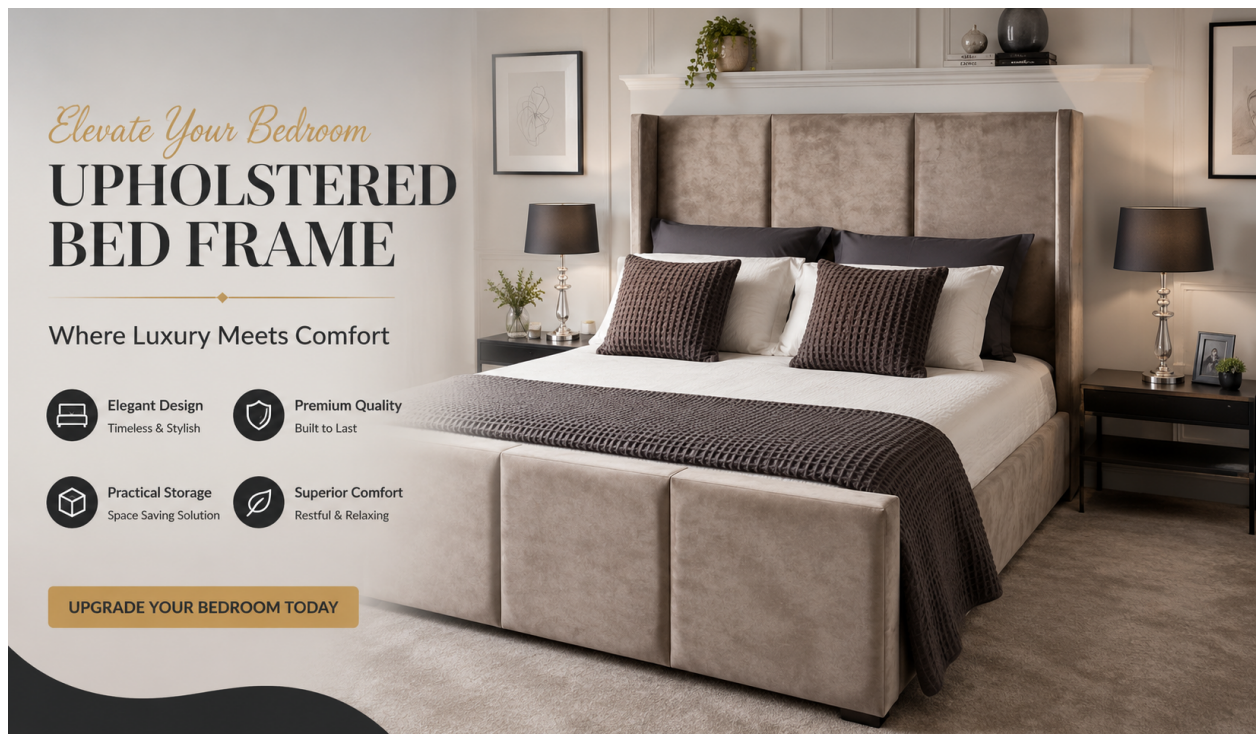


Bed Frame Upholstered | Luxury Designs for UK Homes
